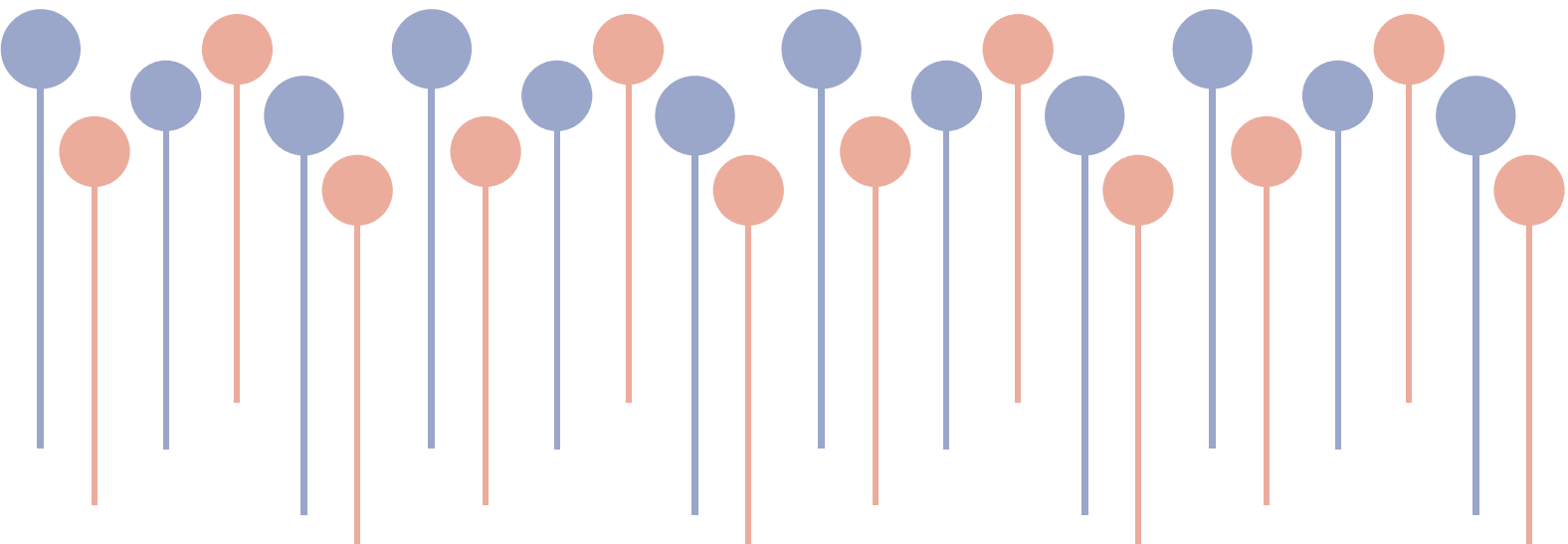
Leadership: A Vital Skill for Every Learner

A Journey of Joy and Learning

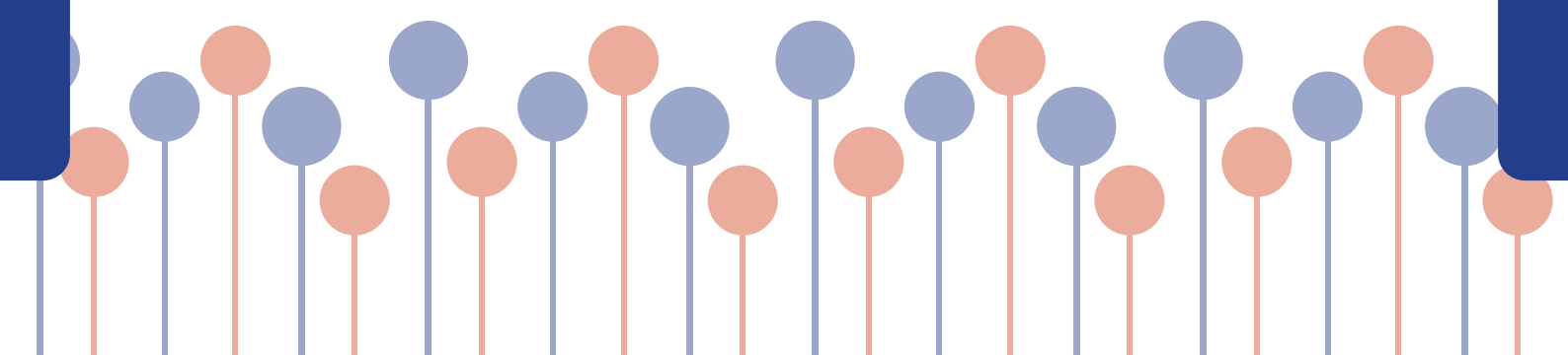
