ARTICLE FROM VICE - PRINCIPAL

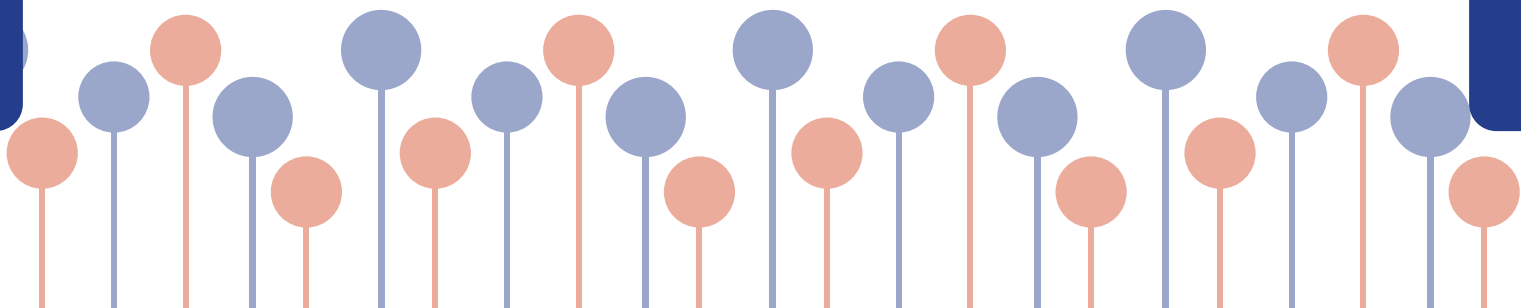

It was a wonderful display of our students' talents and cultural appreciation.



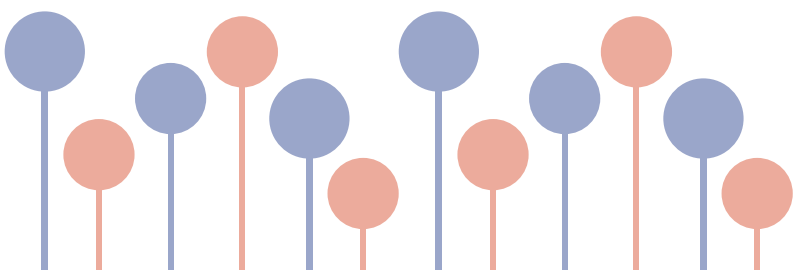
National Parents Day

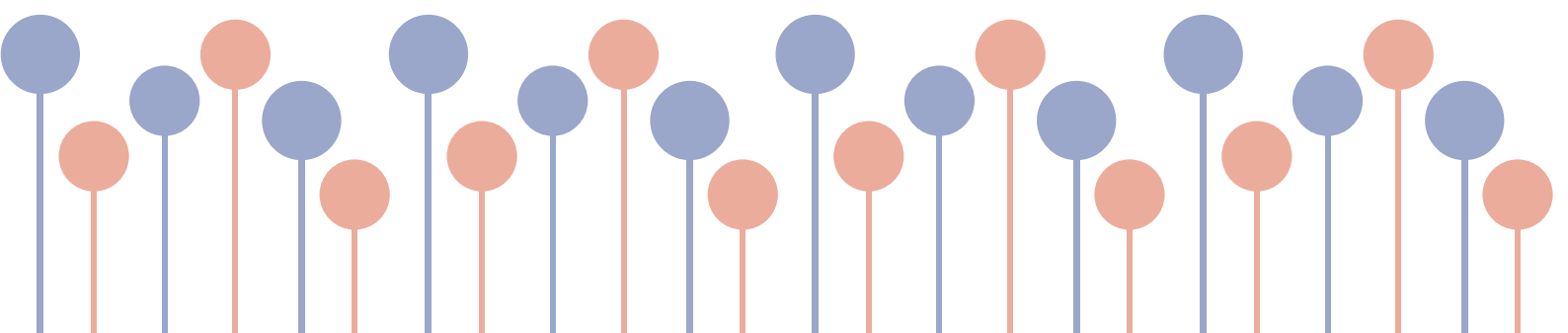
