## Embracing a New Academic Year: Celebrating Student Leadership and Community Spirit



## **Leadership Training in School**

Our school nurtures leadership qualities in young students through various programmes at all levels and grades.

In addition to this, they also have two HSCP captains to instill in student the importance of health safety and child protection. From a very young age, our students are made aware of the rules for safety and they implement the same in their duties. The student council plays an active role and promote a sense of belonging and loyalty, inspiring all the students to be part of the council and build a better future community.

At the classroom level, class teachers conduct elections to elect their class monitors, following and keeping up democratic values of our country. The students fill nomination forms listing their achievements and qualities which are needed to be groomed as leaders, and are selected in an unbiased manner, based on performance in academics, extra-curricular activities, behaviour, discipline, regularity and punctuality.
